Etudiant(e) A - PRESENTATEUR/PRESENTATRICE: This person presents his/her work. Share your driving question, your evidence (what you have learned) and your reasoning/thought process. (2 minutes). Once the presenter has shared, he/she must then listen to the feedback generated from other students. When all feedback has been given, the presenter will repeat what he/she heard (1 minute), and if all students agree on what was said, the presenter will write down the feedback.

Student B: CHEERLEADER & CRITIQUER/CRITIQUEUSE UTILE Since it's always nice to hear about our strengths, this person is responsible for providing one piece of praise for the peer's work. After the praise has been thoughtfully cited, this person provides the first piece of constructive feedback. (Use your brainstorming thoughts from above to help you give both praise and constructive criticism) 1-2 minutes

Student C: CHEERLEADER & CRITIQUER/CRITIQUEUSE UTILE Provide one piece of praise for your group member's work. Then provide the second piece of constructive feedback to the presenter, and DO NOT repeat what has been already said. (Use your brainstorming thoughts from above to help you give both praise and constructive criticism) 1-2 minutes
